

Operation Blazing Sword was founded in Florida on June 12, 2016 as a response to the Pulse Nightclub Massacre. It is a grass-roots organization dedicated to helping everyone, but especially queer people, become responsible firearm owners. If you think you may need a firearm for armed self-defense but don't feel comfortable going to a shooting range or a gun store by yourself, seek out any of our 1500 queer-friendly volunteer educators across the United States and at our website (www.blazingsword.org/instructor-list-page). They will teach you the basics of firearm safety, operation and ownership for no cost and without judgement for your race, faith, gender, politics, biology, sexuality, or manner of dress.

Because Operation Blazing Sword is a 501(c)(3) non-profit, our volunteers are able to claim the expenses incurred in taking a student to the range (range fees, targets, equipment rental, and ammunition expended) as a charitable donation. However, as ammunition can be expensive, it is good manners to offer some compensation, although most of our volunteers will decline.

OPERATION BLAZING SWORD'S THREE GOALS

- 1. To educate *anyone* in the basics of firearms safety and operation, enabling them to make an informed decision regarding whether or not owning a gun is right for them.
- 2. To demonstrate that gun owners do not hate queer people, and in fact want to enable them to protect themselves from violence.
- 3. To champion the fact that responsible gun ownership is a human right. All living beings have an inherent right to self-defense, and firearms are the most effective means of self-defense.

Armed Queers Don't Get Bashed PINK PISTOLS

The Pink Pistols was founded in Boston, Massachusetts in July 2000 to provide a safe environment for members to learn the skills and acquire the knowledge necessary to engage in lawful self-defense of themselves or their loved ones. The Pink Pistols' primary focus is the legal and responsible carry of firearms as defensive tools, but since some jurisdictions make it difficult or even impossible to lawfully carry a firearm, our secondary focus is the advocacy of any form of self-defense in general. The dual mottoes of the Pink Pistols are "Armed Queers Don't Get Bashed" and "Pick On Someone Your Own Caliber".

Pink Pistols chapters across North America endeavor to meet at least once a month for mutual support and safe practice at firearm ranges. Some members of the queer community do not feel comfortable going to gun stores or ranges alone out of concerns that they will be discriminated against or harassed because of their gender or sexuallity, and so going to the range with a Pink Pistols chapter

provides emotional support and safety in numbers to help avoid such discomfort.

Some chapters also include social gatherings to help build community cohesion and interpersonal support; frequently, a chapter will combine a social gathering with a trip to the range, such as lunch in a local restaurant, followed by a range practice session. Public social interactions of this nature help to establish and reinforce public perception that the queer community has more in common with the general public than they exhibit in difference. The Pink Pistols always strives to build bridges along lines of similarity.

THE PINK PISTOLS' MISSION STATEMENT

The Pink Pistols are dedicated to the legal, safe, and responsible use of firearms for self-defense of the queer community. We will no longer allow those who hate and fear gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, or polyamorous persons to use us as targets for their rage. **Self-defense is our right.**We teach queer people to shoot, and then we teach the world that we have done so.
